Women of St. Cross Episcopal Church will culminate a study of Africa when Mrs. Mary-Louise Hooper speaks at their luncheon meeting on Friday, Sept. 29, at 12, in the Parish Hall, 1818 Monterey Blvd., in Hermosa Beach. Mary-Louise Hooper, an American, a Quaker and a grandmother, who won her Phi Beta Kappa at Stanford at the age of 45, is the only white person ever to work inside the African National Congress, the major political organization of black South Africa. Mrs. Hooper immigrated to South Africa in 1955, and worked for two years as assistant to ex-Chief Albert J. Lutuli, three times elected President of the Congress. Mrs. W. R. Hughes, Lomita, program chairman, has made the arrangements for this fascinating speaker and will introduce her. There will be a short business meeting conducted by Mrs. Joseph Coulombe, Manhattan, president.
