 Together with the kindly help of V.N.A. and the homemade device, Mrs. Kendrick has retained her independence.

MRS. KENDRICK says that most people do not realize the work carried out by V.N.A., until the need arises for the service of a nurse.

"Many people don't understand... they don't know of the wonderful job these people (V.N.A.) are doing," says Mrs. Kendrick.

"They have been so nice to me and I only wish more people knew of the work they are doing."

ALTHOUGH handicapped through loss of sight, Mrs. Kendrick can still do most of her own housework and laundry. Occasionally she will bake a cake for a church mission.

In 1958 she won a Pillsbury baking competition. The help given to Mrs. Kendrick is one example of the many services provided by agencies supported by the Community Chest.

## College Nursing Program Slated By Fall Semester

After a six-year study of health and nursing needs of the El Camino College District by school administrators and local health agencies, announcement of the inauguration of a program in nursing was made this week by President Stuart E. Marsee.

Plans call for a two-year schedule of concentrated study toward an associate degree in nursing. Students of the program will be eligible at graduation to write the California State Board of Nursing Examination for licensure as registered nurses.

Coordination of nursing activities will be under the direction of Mrs. Cynthia G. Barnes, R.N. Mrs. Barnes has had 25 years of nursing experience with a range that includes general duty staff nurse, psychiatric nursing, supervisor, public health nursing and teaching.

"THE EL CAMINO program has been initiated to fulfill a very real need for bedside nurses in our own community as well as in all communities," Mrs. Barnes said.

"It is our hope to have a carefully planned curriculum and guidance service that will prepare nurses to administer sympathetic and competent nursing care," she said.

Requirements of the California State Board of Nurse Examiners emphasize that the college must spend one year in planning the correlation of clinical experience and academic study undertaken by the college program.

"IF ALL GOES well, El Camino College will accept students into the nursing department for the fall semester of 1962," Dr. William H. Harless, director of instruction and originator of the program's preparatory investigations, said.

Mrs. Barnes, for the 1961-1962 year, will establish curriculum areas, interview prospective faculty additions in the field and meet with agency representatives to arrange and plan areas of mutual service to the college and community.

"IT MUST BE remembered that the nursing students and the courses relative to nursing such as those in life science are not to be distinct from the general college program," Mrs. Barnes said.

Classes will also include work in the social and psychological sciences, nursing courses and clinical experience in local health agencies under the direct guidance of the college nursing faculty.
