

Saxons To Try Repeat

Hapless Leuzinger, for the past several years the doormat of the Bay League, will come to town tomorrow night to meet North High in an 8 o'clock contest on the Saxon gridiron.

Fresh from a 19-0-7 decision over arch-rival South High, the Saxons should have no trouble getting past a winless Olympian eleven that has given up 149 points to opponents while pushing across only two touchdowns.

Both Leuzinger scores came against Lawndale in the first contest of the season when the Cardinals emerged with a thin 13-10-12 win.

Leuzinger has now fallen before Lennox 19 to 0; Morningside, 32 to 0; Redondo, 13 to 0; Mira Costa, 33 to 0 and Hawthorne, 41 to 0.

IN THE last two years, the Olympians have put only 12 points on the scoreboard. Last time out, they did not tally a single score all season.

Last week, a standing-room-only crowd watched the Saxons move from a scoreless first quarter deadlock to a 6-0-0 intermission lead and then boom out in the final two periods for a 19-0-7 win.

Feeling something like the sparrow that got caught in a badminton game, after losing to Bakersfield and Long Beach in the past two weeks, Harbor's Seahawks return to a more evenly matched type of football this week when they meet the Monarchs of Los Angeles Valley College tomorrow night on the Wilmington field.

This is Harbor's Homecoming game and off comparative records they must be listed as favorites. Valley's total offense this year consists of one touchdown scored against San Diego. While Harbor was losing, 42 to 6, to Long Beach over the weekend, Valley was going down before El Camino, 24-0.

Defensively the Monarchs have been a good team but so far they have not been able to generate much scoring punch. Harbor coach Joe Berry has the problem this week of keeping his team from relaxing too much after meeting what probably are the strongest J. C. teams in the nation in successive weeks.

ALTHOUGH Long Beach and Bakersfield ran up almost identical scores, the Seahawks moved the ball much better against the Vikings. Harbor scored first on a 69 yard drive, chiefly on the runs of Bob Moss returning to full-time action. Another drive was stopped on the Vikings 3 yard line and still another ended with an interception on the one. Harbor equalled Long Beach in first downs, 15 apiece.

As a matter of fact it was Dee Andrews, who was supposed to be injured, who made the big difference. He gained a total of 160 yards in 14 carries, scoring two touchdowns, one on a 56 yard run.

JERRY ORCUTT, a substitute for Lonzo Irvin, also scored two touchdowns and Chris Dawson passed for two more, one being a 69 yarder to Garry Garrison. The other one was a five yarder to Van Wert.

Sam Wicks was the leading gainer for the Hawks, going 88 yards in 7 carries for a 7.1 average. Bob Moss ended up with a 5.1 average in 12 carries and Melvin Thomas, the smallest man on the field, averaged 5.5 in four carries.

Again, Mike Ferragamo, Charles Cunnigan, Sam Bates and Sam Wicks turned in strong defensive games to go with their effort on offense.


