Harbor City-Lomita Takes Lead At First Chest Report Meeting

A record crowd of 500 Community Chest volunteers from all Harbor Area cities attended the area report and luncheon meeting last week in San Pedro.

The banquet room was filled to capacity as workers and leaders gathered to hear results and the progress of the campaign to date.

The first report meeting for the area showed that Harbor City-Lomita leads all other cities and has pushed its cam-

paign over more than 100 per cent of its quota — the first city to do so in the 1961-62 Los Angeles Chest campaign.

VINCE BAUCHIERO, city chairman for H.C.-Lomita, reported \$2,669 — 136.67 per cent — had been raised. Goal set for H.C.-Lomita was \$1,953. Torrance Chest leaders reported 59.84 per cent of their goal had been raised. However, at this stage of the campaign figures fluctuate as reports are still being tabulated as the campaign continues.

Garden Checklist

1. All blooming bulbs, except the earliest Cape bulbs such as freesias, may still be planted.
2. Snails and slugs are active during cooler weather. Bait for them frequently.
3. Plant perennials. Nurseries have a good supply of flat-grown perennial seedlings this month.
4. Make a second planting of ranunculus and anemones. Staggered plantings will lengthen the bloom next spring.
5. Plant camellias for winter color. You can shop for them as they come into bloom, which means any time up to spring. Each week brings new varieties to bloom.
