

### Pastor Plans Service on Thanksgiving

The Narbonne Avenue Baptist Church of Lomita will have a Thanksgiving service on Sunday. The pastor, Robert A. Wells, will speak on the subject "A Grateful Heart."

### Junior Colleges Send Many to Universities

Twenty-seven per cent of under-graduate enrollment at the seventh University of California campuses are junior college transfer students, estimates of University officials reveal.

The number of transfer students is expected to increase due to the master plan for higher education in California. This plan will divert approximately 50,000 lower division students from state colleges and universities to junior colleges by 1975.

REASONS FOR the diversion

are the high scholastic records made by junior college transfer students in state colleges and universities.

Records also show these transfer students have scholastic records fully comparable to those students who took their first collegiate work at the University.

"THIS SPEAKS well not only for the quality of the students coming to the University from the junior colleges; but of

the faculty, staff and programs of the junior colleges," commented Frank Kidner, University Dean of Educational Relations.

### Students Get Merit Award

THIS TEST was a three-hour examination covering five separate areas of educational development.

"The Letters of Commendation provide tangible recognition of the commended students' ability," John M. Stalnaker, president of NMSC, stated.

"To increase their opportunities to obtain financial assistance if they need it, the Merit Corporation sends the names, home addresses, and the test scores of all commended students to the two colleges they indicated as their preferred choices at the time they took the qualifying test," Stalnaker added.
