**County District Attorney Marks Service in Office**

Monday, District Attorney William B. McKesson will have earned the distinction of being the fifth district attorney of Los Angeles County in 110 years to have served five continuous years in that office.

McKesson was unanimously appointed district attorney by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors in 1956, after the demise of the then present incumbent. Prior to his appointment as district attorney, McKesson had been with the County Counsel's Office for some 17 years and had served as superior court judge for over 12 years.

**PUBLIC EXPRESSION** approving McKesson's appointment and acknowledging his integrity and capable administration of the district attorney's office was overwhelmingly concurred in by the electorate in the election of 1958 when nearly a million people cast their ballots for his election as district attorney, the largest number of votes up to that time ever given to any candidate for any public office, county, state, or federal, in the history of Los Angeles County.

Again, in 1960, McKesson, opposed by Adolph Alexander, received the voters' overwhelming mandate for re-election as district attorney for a new four-year term by more than 345,000 votes. McKesson's service as district attorney has been marked by emphasis of public confidence and trust in his administration.

**HIS IMPARTIAL, effective** and experienced direction of the district attorney's office has attained nationwide recognition. Prosecutors, jurists, and government officials throughout the United States and from many foreign nations have come to Los Angeles and Judge McKesson to learn the techniques he has perfected which have resulted in, and recognized as the most outstanding prosecutor's office in America.

McKesson has served as a member of the California Youth Authority where his talents, efforts, achievements, and the successful rehabilitation of juvenile delinquents received national attention. An active member of both the president's and the governor's

advisory committees on children and youth, McKesson is a recognized authority on the establishment, role, and functions of juvenile courts.

He was instrumental in the establishment of the internationally famous Delinquency Control Institute of the University of Southern California and has served as chairman of the institute's advisory committee since its inception.

His election and re-election as judge of the Superior Court in 1944, 1948, and 1954, and as district attorney in 1958 and 1960 by such outstanding popular margins, was considered a reflection of the esteem, confidence, and appreciation the voters of Los Angeles County hold for McKesson's integrity, fidelity, and dedication to public service.

McKesson has been the recipient of numerous awards from national and international, professional, civic, fraternal, legal, judicial, and youth service organizations for his contributions in the legal, judicial, and youth service fields, emphasizing his distinguished record of service to his fellow man.

McKesson on his inauguration as district attorney of Los Angeles County, pledged that the Office of the District Attorney would earn the respect and confidence of the people through faithful, efficient, and impartial administration of justice. The people of Los Angeles County have recognized he has fulfilled that pledge with the same dignity, integrity, and honor he brought to every public office he has ever held.

A small reception has been planned by McKesson's personal staff to honor his attaining this hallmark by reason of his distinguished public service.
