"This is the best Bill of Rights program that has been presented in Los Angeles County since the tradition started," Supervisors Kenneth Hahn and Ernest E. Debs said, following a presentation made in the Hall of Administration last week by El Camino College students and instructors.

Observing the annual Bill of Rights program, the ECC presentation was given before school and governmental officials, history students and foreign exchange students. Portions of the program were filmed for television.

ENTITLED "We Have Responsibilities," the script was prepared by Dr. John P. Carney of the college political science department. Working with Dr. Carney in the presentation of the program were John A. de la Hays, assistant director of instruction, who accepted a citation in behalf of the college; R. Neil Hill, music instructor; Dr. William H. Harless, director of instruction; Hamilton M. Maddaford, assistant director of student personnel; Harold Wennstrom, assistant director of instruction; Stanley F. Wilson, speech instructor, and Richard Schwarzman, audio-visual coordinator.

Among college officials present for the program were Foster A. Day, member of the board of trustees from Redondo Beach; Dr. Stuart E. Marjoe, ECC president; Lehman Brock, director of business, and Dr. Harless.

Neil Hill, music instructor and director of the a cappella choir, which offered the musical presentation.

Ed Palmer and Jeffries were baritone soloists for the latter number.

SPEAKERS WERE Dennis Scholl and Gary Bradbrook, with Kay Grantham and Maddaford accompanying on the piano and organ, respectively. Dr. C. C. Trillingham, county superintendent of schools, characterized the performance as "a tremendous program... tops" in his concluding remarks.

Supervisor Hahn, recently returned from Europe on a study of comparative education, praised the quality of education in the United States and in Los Angeles County specifically.
