

State Assemblymen Meet in February

 Previously, I stated in this column that all mail should be sent to me at Post Office Box 27, Redondo Beach, until Feb. 1962, and thereafter to State Capitol, Sacramento, until the 1962 Budget and Special Sessions are completed.

The latest information is that the California Legislature will convene in Sacramento on Monday, Feb. 5, 1962, and remain in session only a very few days, after which we will recess and return home for the balance of February.

FOR OR ABOUT March 1, 1962, we return to Sacramento, will remain in Session during all of March and until we dispose of all subjects placed on the "call" issued by the Governor for the Special Session, which runs concurrently with the Budget Session and thereafter continues (after the end of the Budget Session ends) until our work is completed. Nobody knows when we can complete the work of the Special Session but a good guess is about April 15, 1962.

For the above reasons, please send all mail for me to Post Office Box 327, Redondo Beach, until March 1, 1962. During the very few days in February that shall be in Sacramento, my secretary will be in daily communication with me by telephone and will send urgent mail to me if it can reach me before we end our very short February meeting. Otherwise, mail will be held for my return from Sacramento.

UNDER THE leadership of John F. Kennedy, President of the United States of America, prompt action is being taken in one phase of the communist threat. Both Democrats and Republicans have been complaining that President Kennedy is lagging on speeches but short on performance, but here is a case where he really is doing something. He is arranging for the government of the United States of America to sell thirty million dollars (\$30 million) in wheat, plus about ten million dollars (\$10 million) in vegetable oils, to Tito's communist Yugoslavia!

This is in addition to the military airplanes already sent to Tito with Yugoslavian communist crews trained at U.S. aircraft bases to fly and maintain these combat airplanes which can be used against us and our allies, not to mention innocent victims of communist aggression in any part of the world.

President Kennedy probably will make a clean breast of this strong program of his, but his spokesmen will argue that the reason for helping Tito and his communist Yugoslavia is that by helping Tito we are showing the world that a communist nation which takes help from the United States can advance faster than a communist which does not take our money, airplanes, ammunition, and food.

IF IT IS logical thinking, then all definitions and explanations of logic in dictionaries and encyclopaedias should be rewritten. I call this fuzzy thinking and downright stupidity. Incidentally, this is my own personal opinion and does not necessarily reflect the official views of the Department of Defense, the Navy Department, or the U. S. Marine Corps. Of course, what Navy and Marine Corps people say and think privately is something you can well understand, and the same thing applies to the U. S. Air Force, the U. S. Army, and the U. S. Coast Guard. They are all muzzled as to public utterance under this administration.

If you have plenty of time and want to waste your time and postage, write and tell President Kennedy what you think about aid to communist Yugoslavia and Tito. You may get an answer but it will not be written by the President because he is too busy to read, much less answer such mail. He is too busy making speeches and thinking up new ways to solve the communist problem, such as aid to Tito, to bother with your mail. Someone will send you a nice, noncommittal letter but the signature will not be that of the President.

WRITE TO U. S. Senator Thomas H. Kuchel (Republican); and to U. S. Senator Clair Engle (Democrat). Send letters to them to the Senate Office Building, Washington, D. C. Senator Engle is not up for re-election this year, but Senator Kuchel is up for re-election to a six-year term, and he is very anxious to hear from everyone in California on this subject.

Be sure to ask Senator Kuchel how he has voted in the past on U. S. aid to communist countries and "neutral" countries (such as India); and urge him to tell you what he is doing to stop further aid to Tito's communist Yugoslavia. Plans for Hawthorne Improvement Accepted

Approval of plans and specifications for the improvement of Hawthorne Avenue between Pacific Coast Highway and Newton Street was announced by Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Bids for the project will be opened by the Board on Jan. 23, 1962. Improvements were designed by the Los Angeles County Road Department and the project is scheduled for completion in June, 1962.

Work on this 0.4-mile segment of arterial highway will consist of constructing concrete curb and gutter, pavement, and drainage structures, to provide a six-lane highway between a 100-foot right of way.
