Dominguez Water Asks For Increase in Rate

The Dominguez Water Corp. has asked the California Public Utilities Commission for authority to raise certain of its block rates by about \$11,500 a year to offset the higher cost of water purchased from the Metropolitan Water District. The West Basin Municipal Water District, from which the company buys its MWD water, increased the 1962 cost by \$2 an acre foot, according to the application. The company wants to raise

its rate for block No. 3 (2,500 through 17,500 cubic feet of water a month) by one cent per 100 cubic feet; its rate for block No. 4 (20,000 through 80,000 cubic feet) and block No. 6 (all over 2,000,000 cubic feet per month) by one-half cent per 100 cubic feet. The company also proposes to increase its metered irrigation service and combination residential and irrigation service charges by 1.8 mills per 100 cubic feet of water per month.

Dominguez Water Corp. serves some 16,000 customers in a 35-mile square area south of Los Angeles, north of Wilmington, east of Redondo Beach and west of the Los Angeles River.
