

Letters to Governor Urged by Legislator

During the month of March 1962, the legislature can consider only items pertaining to the budget unless the governor gives his written consent to the introduction of bills presented during the special session which runs concurrently with the budget session.

This is in accordance with the state Constitution and applies to any governor during a budget session.

This has been explained several times in this column, but readers of this newspaper continue to write to me, urging me to introduce bills, and I then explain that I am willing to introduce the bills they want, but they must write to the governor and get his consent, or I cannot introduce any bills except budget items.

FURTHERMORE, the governor does not put any particular bill on his approved list (called a "call") for the special session, but approves the introduction of bills falling within a particular subject.

Therefore, in writing to the governor, please ask him to approve the introduction of legislation with a subject, such as narcotics, pornography, etc. It is not necessary to go into details. Address your letters to Gov. Edmund G. ("Pat") Brown, State Capitol, Sacramento 14, Calif.

I HAVE written the following letter to Governor Brown:

"Please give your consent for the introduction of bills on the subjects listed below during the special session which runs concurrently with the March 1962 budget session:

"1. School district organization, particularly bills which extend the present deadline by which county school committees, school district organizations, etc., must file a school district master plan and make related changes.

"2. School textbooks. There is a widespread demand for legislation in this field.

"3. Communist activities. The Communists were taken off the ballot by law in California, by description and not by name. This complies with the Supreme Court decision rendered prior to 1953, when I introduced my own bill which became a law in 1953. However, we need laws to curtail activities by Communists in other areas.

"4. BEACH and shoreline protection. In 1955, when my amendment to the Shell Canning Act (originally A.B. 3402) was incorporated into the law, it protected certain shoreline areas against oil drilling except where certain cities owned their own right to vote on oil drilling, but I neglected to include gas and minerals. Now that people are attempting to dredge for minerals along certain shorelines, the law should be amended to include gas and minerals, and specify dredging as well as drilling.

"5. Resorting, particularly providing that the state does not pre-empt the field of vice legislation and that county and city ordinances prevail when not in violation of the Constitution and when they are stronger than any state law.

"6. Narcotics, particularly legislation regarding the admissibility of evidence in narcotic cases. Strong penalties mean nothing without convictions and convictions cannot be obtained if the law-enforcement officers are 'hand-cuffed' by restrictions on the admissibility of evidence, consistent with the U.S. and state Constitutions.

"7. PORNOGRAPHY, alias obscene literature, motion pictures, television shows, radio programs, etc. I find that we can do much toward solving this problem with a law providing for what the lawyers call a 'proceeding in rem'; that is, the action is brought against the indecent object, thus avoiding any argument about police censorship, etc. As a lawyer, you will understand that a proceeding 'in rem' is a new approach for California and it will work.
