

GOP Candidate Strikes Out at Apathy in Talk

"The only thing wrong with politics is that more men are not willing to participate in it," Dr. Merle H. Boyce, who is seeking the Republican nomination for Congress in the 17th District, told a Lincoln's Day gathering here Monday evening.

Speaking to a crowd of nearly 200 persons at the Polynesian, Dr. Boyce explained his entry into the contest by asking, "If I'm not willing to serve, who shall?"

DR. BOYCE spoke of his frustration at the lack of "proper representation during the past 20 years." He said it was a time for action.

"We owe to ourselves and to our children a leadership who will work for us regardless of the personal sacrifice," he said.

"WE CAN no longer afford the luxury of an incumbent whose only qualification is that he has been able to keep his job for 20 years," the GOP candidate said.

Dr. Boyce was introduced by Dr. George R. Wall, vice president of the Los Angeles Harbor Commission.

Speaking earlier on "A Nation's Perspective," was Richard D. Croft, assistant to the President of California College of Medicine.

Special NROTC Program Available at El Camino

El Camino College students have been invited to participate in a special Junior College Transfer NROTC program, W. Holmes Smith, assistant director of student personnel, announced today.

Students may qualify for admission by being admitted to any of the 52 NROTC colleges or universities, Smith said.

Deadline for the 1962 summer session is today. The program includes subsidy for room, board and tuition plus pay. The curriculum will include 12 units of lower division naval science courses.

To be eligible for selection, a student must be a graduate of a recognized junior college or in the final semester at time of application. He must also be accepted for entrance by one of the 52 universities offering the NROTC program.


CROSSWORD PUZZLE
