

Ogden Nash to Speak At El Camino Friday

Ogden Nash, noted poet and humorist, will appear at El Camino College, Friday at 8:15 p.m. in the first of the series of spring lectures.

The lecture, entitled "The Portable Ogden Nash," will include commentary on verse to be recited. Skylarking humor and social satire are combined with Nash's craftsmanship to produce an unprecedented type of humor.

E. R. CARSON, student store manager, announced today that tickets for the lecture are on sale at the student store. General admission is \$1. If tickets remain following the presale,

they will be sold at the door. Before taking up writing, Nash attended Harvard University. He was a school teacher, bond salesman, advertising man and, briefly, managing editor of The New Yorker.

NASH BEGAN his career as an author of light verse in 1931. His work has appeared in such magazines as The New Yorker, Esquire and the Saturday Evening Post.

Nash's most recent book, "The Private Dining Room," was preceded by such books as

"Parents Keep Out," and "Family Reunion." He also was co-author of the musical play "One Touch of Venus."



Garden Checklist

1. All bareroot fruit and nut trees should be planted this month while they are still available.
2. Ranunculus may still be planted — either the bulbs or the seedlings from nursery flats.
3. Fuchsias should be pruned this month. Cut them back hard to promote new flowering wood.
4. Lawn renovation can start this month. The seedbed should be prepared now if you plan to start a new lawn in March or early April.
5. Bareroot roses should be planted no later than the next two or three weeks, if you expect any early bloom. Roses should be pruned by now, so hurry if yours haven't been.

Many motorists have probably noticed many changes being made at the signal controlled intersections in our city. At some of our busy intersections a green arrow is being added. This green arrow appears to have some drivers confused.

When you are facing an intersection equipped with a green arrow you will note when the green arrow is not visible there will be a red signal facing you. The green arrow will become visible only when traffic opposing is stopped for a red light, thus when you are making your turn on the green arrow there should be no opposing traffic moving.

The purpose of the green arrow is to assist you while making a turn. Using this system a turning vehicle can make a left turn without the hazards that normally would be encountered at the normal intersection.

AS YOU approach this type of intersection and the green arrow is visible then you may complete your turn, but if the arrow is not visible then you must stop and wait for the arrow to appear.

At some of the busy intersections there are pedestrian signs which will tell the pedestrian when he may cross the street. If the sign is flashing DON'T WALK, don't start across the street until the sign says WALK. As a pedestrian you are required to obey this or any other type of traffic control sign and by failing to do so are eligible for a citation.

THESE TYPES of traffic devices are installed not only for the convenience of the driving and walking public but to control traffic in the safest possible manner. These controls are the most modern devices available to assist the public and speed up the normal traffic flow. If we all abide and familiarize ourselves with these devices we can move from one point to another in the fastest as well as the safest manner.

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
