

Foundation Giving Loans to Students

A \$50,000 Ford Foundation grant to the University of Southern California will help finance the education of candidates for Doctor of Philosophy degrees who wish to become engineering teachers.

Announcing receipt of the grant, Dr. Norman Topping, USC president, explained that loans made to students from Ford Foundation funds need not be repaid if the students do get their Ph.D. degrees and if they do join the faculties of engineering schools for at least five years.

Candidates must have a master's degree in engineering, a related science, or mathematics, be 40 years of age or younger, be admitted to Graduate School and seriously interested in a career in engineering education.

THERE IS a great shortage of engineering teachers in the United States, according to Dr. Alfred C. Ingersoll, dean of the USC School of Engineering, who will administer the Ford Foundation grant on the campus.

He is chairman of the Pacific Southwest section of the American Society of Engineering Education and a director of the Society's national relations with industry division.

At least 8000 new faculty members of greatly increased quality will be needed in the United States by 1970 to hold engineering at its expected level nationally in comparison with other sciences, Dean Ingersoll said.

NEW ENGINEERING professors with the Ph.D. degree are needed to teach the many students who will be seeking the doctorate to go into industry, government, or teaching themselves, he said.

"This grant is part of a long-range program to gear up engineering education in this country to its highest level," Dean Ingersoll said. "We at USC are proud to be part of this effort."
