

# Bruinsma Says Jobs In Area Threatened

Republican Congressional candidate Ted Bruinsma Thursday told members of Californians for Goldwater that "not enough care and attention is being given the problem of defense for Southern California industry."

"Skills developed by workers in aircraft, missile and electronics firms in Southern California is unmatched anywhere in the country and massive efforts must be undertaken on a national scale to keep these

fine, well-trained workers busy," Bruinsma said.

"It is not wise nor sound economically, nor just for that matter to allow contracts to be given plants in other parts of the country just for political reasons," Bruinsma declared.

"OF COURSE there are vast areas of unemployment in West Virginia, but it is inconceivable that missile and other technical government tracts would be granted in this area because the men and women are not trained for this type of technical work," Bruinsma said.

Speaking at the meeting held at Western Avenue Golf Course, Bruinsma remarked that all California congressmen must "work together for the area and not be drawn into the web of politics in this campaign distribution."

"It is not in the national interest to award these contracts to other regions which are presently incapable of competing with local companies," Bruinsma said.

COMMENTING on his own campaign Bruinsma said "more than 500 people in the district have signed pledges to support my campaign, and more post cards come in every day."

"It is encouraging to see how much strength a Republican candidate can develop in a district which is so predominantly Democrat," Bruinsma declared.

"According to my campaign committee chairman John Sonborn, we will have 1,000 names on the committee by March 15, and 5,000 by May 1," Bruinsma announced.

"AT THAT, anyone interested in working on the campaign need only visit the headquarters which are located at 420 S. Gaffey St., San Pedro, to be assigned a part of the campaign," the candidate said.

"The job of congressman in the 17th District needs a man who can combine youth with maturity, and a man who has experience in both business and industry so vitally necessary in these fast-moving times," Bruinsma said.
