Kurtz Campaigners Start With Family

The candidacy of George Kurtz for Torrance City Council is built around a hard core of "campaigners" — all with a special interest in his political success.

The precinct workers, all residents of 23004 Evalyn Ave., are wife Eileen and the three Kurtz kids, Robert, Clifton, and Kenneth. The boys (Robert is 10 and the twins are 8) admittedly travel in Torrance's younger, nonvoting set, but their support is unanimous, anyway.

Eileen, who learned the gentle art of doorbell pushing and telephone calling in several years' service with PTA, has greater latitude in vote-getting effectiveness. At present, in addition to the duties at home, she is president of the Calle Mayor PTA and has been active in the American Cancer Society fund drives.

WHEN SHE isn't rearing three Little Leaguers, guiding the fortunes of the parent-teacher group, and providing aid and solace to her attorney husband-turned-candidate, she is also an avid ocean swimmer during the entire year.

While the boys get in shape for Little League this spring, their father, an Older Leaguer, works out with them in the family yard, but exercises a more notable baseball talent in the management of the league — last year, for instance, Kurtz was ways and means chairman of the Torrance American Little League.

HE IS ALSO chairman of the YMCA Youth and Legislative Committee, chairman of the Torrance Library Commission, and past chairman of the Torrance Traffic Safety Council. He is also a past director of the South Bay Bar Assn.

In addition to family affairs, recreation and civic activities, and a busy Torrance law practice, Kurtz' personal interests are many and varied.

HE HAS more than a passing knowledge of contemporary art, for example, and an interest in music that ranges from Mozart to Gerry Mulligan. In the manner of English stu-

dents everywhere (he received his B.A. in English at UCLA), he maintains a large and well-used personal library.

The Kurtz family moved to Torrance six years ago from Berkeley, where Kurtz received his law degree at University of California. He worked his way through law school in a northern California cannery, having resigned as a high school English instructor in Santa Cruz to resume his studies.
