### Improvements Set For Lomita Streets

Allocation of \$2,950 for extending the pavement on the west side of Walnut Street and the north side of 240th Street at their intersection to join existing curbs has been approved by County Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Similar improvements will be made on the east side of Eshelman Avenue and south side of 253rd Street at their intersection.

## 190th Street Closes For 60 Days Monday

A Harbor Freeway off-ramp and a segment of 190th Street will be closed for 60 days each beginning next Monday morning to facilitate a sewer construction project, the Board of Public Works announced yesterday.

The Board said the 190th Street southbound off-ramp of the Harbor Freeway will be sealed off, and 190th Street from Vermont Avenue to the

Harbor Freeway will be closed to through traffic.

These closures, said the Board, were necessitated by the construction of a sewage system and related structures in the 190th Street-Vermont Avenue district.

Contract for this job was awarded by the Board to R. E. Ziebarth & Co. and S. E. Alper for \$263,117 to construct a sewage pumping plant in 190th Street easterly of Hamilton Street, abandoning the existing pumping plant at 187th Place and installing force mains and gravity sewers in 190th Street and in Vermont Avenue.

The entire project is scheduled for completion in nine months.
