TV CANDIDS by Terrence O'Flaherty

There's been an awful lot of talk about outer space lately — how it feels to be weightless, how it feels to see four sunsets in one day, how it feels to be caught with your clamps down, etc.

If we must face the space age, how is it going to feel to be dressed up in those nylon Doctor Dentons? I have not been able to get through to Colonel Glenn in this matter so I picked the next best source of information — George Nader, the star of "The Man and the Challenge." In this series he seems to spend most of his time zipping himself into the New Look for Men. How do the spacesuits feel?

"Terrible," said the actor. "In the winter they're cold and in the summer they are hot. They don't keep a press in the trousers and gravy spots won't come out. There's no choice of a two or three-button model, either."

I was also shocked to learn that they're not air conditioned like Glenn's outfit.

"Hot weather scripts are always filmed in summer — preferable in Death Valley — and underwater scenes are shot in the middle of the winter," said Nader. "I think it's some kind of union ruling down in Hollywood."

But that's all behind him now. Even though "The Man and the Challenge" is still being seen, he's currently working on "Shannon," a newer role in which he plays a hard-hitting insurance investigator.

Nader is one of the rough-cut stones in the Screen Gems family, which produces his latest series. He's good looking in a rugged sort of way and is one star who isn't complaining about being stifled in a weekly half-hour series.

"It's hard work and I enjoy it. We shoot fast and I'm not able to sit down for a second. 'Shannon' is entertainment and the scripts are better-than-average adult stuff that seems to attract a large audience."

Nader was born in Los Angeles — living proof that people actually have children down here — but the rest of the biography is routine: Occidental College, U.S. Navy, Pasadena Community Playhouse, and sudden stardom in a Universay movie called "Monsoon."

"It still pops up on television occasionally and I run from the house. It was filmed in India and it had a big storm in it. In the story I had come there to marry someone but met Ursula Theiss and we fell madly in love and had some love scenes in a temple which were the only good thing in the film and they were cut out."

The list of his movies that followed makes good reading itself: "Memory of Love" . . . "Sins of Jezebel" . . . "Miss Robinson Crusoe" . . . "Lady Godiva" . . . "The Second Greatest Sex" . . . "Four Girls in Town" and (fittingly enough after all this) . . . "Man Afraid."

"My first TV break came as 'Ellery Queen.' We did 22 hours of live shows in color. When the show moved to New York I got my release from the role because I'm a Californian and want to live out here. People thought I was crazy. That's when I got into my first spacesuit and did 'Man and the Challenge.' When that folded I went into 'Shannon' and we just finished 37 of them. We'll start shooting again in June."

Nader lives in Sherman Oaks and is a bachelor — which must have been hard on him while shooting "Man and the Challenge." There was no one to zip up his spacesuit. Or unzip it either. I guess.
