

Temple Menorah to Honor Mrs. Grancell on Friday

Mrs. Anna Grancell, noted philanthropist, will be honored at Friday evening services at Temple Menorah at 8:30. An Oneg Shabbat following services will honor her on the occasion of her 80th birthday.

Mrs. Grancell and her late husband, Isaac Grancell, inventor, are founders of Temple Menorah. She is a charter member of both the Temple and its Sisterhood. Future building plans for the Temple which serves residents throughout the South Bay and Palos Verdes Peninsula areas call for the construction of a small chapel to be known as the Grancell Chapel.

MRS. GRANCELL, born in Philadelphia, came to Los Angeles as a young girl because her doctor feared for her health. Now semi-retired, Mrs. Grancell was an active business executive until her late

70s. She worked with her husband throughout their long married life, raised a family and still found time to help others in need.

Her generosity has become legendary, having contributed to the California Home for the Aged in Reseda, City of Hope which she donated money for a children's playground, Sun-Air Foundation for Asthmatic Children, Heart and Cancer Chapters Cedars of Sinai, a wing at Gateways Hospital, and a wing at Cedar-Sinai Hospital.

Open House Slated for Next Sunday
