Work Progressing On Center Strips

Installation of median barriers to prevent fatal head-on collisions on the Harbor Freeway is progressing on schedule despite a setback by recent adverse weather, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn said yesterday. State Highway officials have informed Supervisor Hahn that the contractor, Wulfert Construction Co., is expected to finish the project by mid-May, weather permitting.

TWO TYPES of the most modern barriers — wooden post and cable chain fencing — are being installed on the freeway between the interchange and 120th Street.

The State Highway Commission authorized work on the barriers after a vigorous campaign by Supervisor Hahn underlined the need for such life-saving installations.

HAHN, AS EARLY as 1957, began pressing state officials to expedite the program. He directed repeated correspondence, facts and figures to Governor Brown, the State Highway Commission, State Department of Public Works, and the Division of Highways. Supervisor Hahn pointed out

that the Harbor Freeway is the world's most heavily traveled roadway with a daily average of 200,000 cars, trucks and buses.

SINCE IT WAS opened in 1954, more than 60 persons have been killed in accidents on the freeway, most of them in head-on collisions caused by the absence of safety fencing, Hahn said.

In his drive for median barriers on the Harbor Freeway, Supervisor Hahn pointed out that time, money — and lives — can be saved if dividers are installed while freeways are under construction. This policy has been adopted by the state in many current freeway projects.


State and Local Tax Deductions Different
