

Welcome Home for Dills Scheduled on Wednesday

Honoring Assemblyman Clayton A. Dills' 20 years service to the 67th District as a member of the California Legislature, a committee of reading citizens and public officials will head a reception at the Higgins Patio in North Torrance, Wednesday, at 8 p.m.

Mayors, councilmen and other public officials of Gardena, Lawndale, Redondo Beach, and Hawthorne have joined in the reception committee of which Miss Rose Sarukian of Torrance has been named chairman.

An appreciation presentation to Assemblyman Dills for his long service to the District and especially his authorship of the bill which established El Camino College in the area will be made at the reception.

IT WAS also Assemblyman Dills who authored bills acquiring three state armories and child care center for the district.

He sponsored over 100 bills to obtain veteran home loan benefits, increased aid to the blind and aged, state building aid to school districts, and

state apportionment for education. Educators have taken a very active part with the welcoming committee because Assemblyman Dills is such a well known friend and outstanding advocate for advanced opportunities in the district.

IT WAS Assemblyman Dills who authored, fought for, and passed Assembly Bill 9 which provides for stronger narcotics penalties, his backers report.




