Normal Body Functions Needed for Child Growth

Children cannot learn and progress at a normal rate if any factor of the body function is abnormal, parents and friends of South Bay School were told by a world renowned authority on learning problems last week.

Milton Tobias, M.D., speaking to the group at the school, 1103 Tulita Ave., Redondo Beach, spoke on the biology of the body, pointing out that a complete balance was necessary to utilize the full efficiency of the child.

IF ANY FACTOR of body function, such as perception, hearing, speech, blood sugar, or other is causing difficulty, the body and learning cannot progress at the "normal" rate, Dr. Tobias said.

He stressed the importance of a complete program for each child, saying medical help may be necessary to assure proper performance, along with special education with perceptive training to over-

come learning problems. He informed understanding parents to see that all factors are as near correct as possible in their child.

Dr. Tobias emphasized his comments with a report of a college student who maintained an honor program with the aid of medication, but saw his grades drop until he was forced to withdraw when the medication was withdrawn.

AMONG THOSE present at the invitation of Warren Scherich, director of the South Bay School, was Dr. Allen Pyeatt, Torrance optometrist, whose extensive eye training program is widely used.

Scherich reports that summer classes at the private school will be held from June 18 to July 27 with two classes scheduled for 9 a.m. to noon, and from 1 to 4 p.m. Speed reading classes have also been scheduled from 4:30 to 5:30 p.m. Class enrollments will be kept small, Scherich said.
