El Camino Executive to Take Part in Conference

Hamilton Maddaford, assistant director of student personnel, El Camino College, will serve as a discussion group recorder at the first annual California Conference on Higher Education, it was announced by Dr. Frederic W. Hile, higher education executive of the California Teachers Assn. (CTA).

The conference, to be held Friday and Saturday at the Statler-Hilton Hotel, Los Angeles, will feature nationally known speakers, Dr. Hile said.

Maddaford is one of 90 members of the conference leadership team.

Theme of the two-day meeting will be "Higher Education in California: Its Responsibilities for Values in American Life."

Conference delegates, representing the state colleges, junior colleges, the University of California and independent colleges, will consider if, when and how colleges can teach values to their students, Dr. Hile said.

The conference is sponsored by the CTA Commission on Higher Education.

Garden Checklist

1. Use shears to trim ivy back on fences and along walks. Ivy will stand cutting back with no ill effects.
2. Balled nursery stock should be planted without removing the burlap from around the roots. After the plant is in the ground, cut the tie at the top.
3. Plant zinnias, asters, dwarf dahlias and other bedding plants for summer color.
4. Seedling tuberous begonias are available and may be planted in pots or in beds.
5. Try planting hibiscus in a container. Keep it thoroughly watered and feed it once a month during growth and bloom.
