

Doctor's Degree to Be Awarded Blind Student

A Torrance resident's brother will add "doctor" to his name at graduation exercises Sunday at the University of Tennessee even though the graduate is blind.

He is Thomas W. Lucik, brother of Joseph Lucik, 19507 Entradero Ave.

The blind student is a candidate for a doctor of philosophy degree in clinical psychology, a degree that requires five years of intensive graduate work at UT.

"THOUGH VISUALLY handicapped for all practical reasons, he has done an outstanding job," said Dr. Carl N. Sippelle, associate professor of psychology and associate director of the U-T Psychological Service and Research Center.

Lucik is married and has two children, a girl 12 and boy 10.

FOR THE PAST two years, Lucik has interned as a clinical psychologist with the Veterans Administration. Now he is an assistant clinical psychologist at the U-T Psychological Service and Research Center. Following his June graduation, Lucik will be a staff psychologist at the State Hospital, Milledgeville, Ga., the second largest mental hospital in the world.

Lucik holds membership in American Psychological Assn., Southeastern Psychological Assn., and Delta Sigma Rho. His research has been on "The Differential Effects of Stress on Blind and Seeing People."

Kuchel Joins in Effort To Renew G.I. Insurance

U. S. Senator Thomas H. Kuchel has just made his seventh attempt to provide former servicemen a chance to reactivate Federal wartime life insurance which they let expire or failed to purchase.

The Senior California Senator is cosponsor of a new bill incorporating features intended to overcome past Veterans Administration objections under which ex-G.I.'s in good health would be given a year to obtain coverage they never acquired while previously eligible or to revive lapsed policies.

The new legislation, introduced by Senator Russell Long of Louisiana, is a revision of measures which the Senate

twice has passed since the beginning of the 87th Congress in 1961 and similar in purpose to other bills which Kuchel joined in proposing in each of the three preceding Congresses.

On a total of four occasions, such measures have received Senate approval, only to be turned down by the House.

"UNDER THIS latest bill, which covers service-disabled veterans along with others, simple justice would be done those men who for one reason or another do not have insurance coverage to which they were entitled while in uni-
