

Peaches Make Bow, Introducing Summer

Fresh peach tarts are a joy to serve and easily made.

Whether you are a talented pastry chef or not makes little difference for flaky baked tart shells may be obtained at most large markets.

The filling, in addition to luscious peaches, is made of whipped cream, macaroons and vanilla. This adds elegance to the sun-ripened goodness of fresh peaches, now making their seasonal debut.

PEACH TARTS, MACARON CREAM

- 3 large fresh peaches
- Honey
- 1 pint whipping cream
- 12 coconut macaroons, crumbled
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 6 baked individual tart shells

Peel peaches and cut in halves. Brush with honey to prevent darkening. Whip cream until stiff. Fold in crumbled macaroons, vanilla and salt.

Spoon 1/2 to 3/4 cup cream mixture into tart shells covering bottom and sides generously. Cut each peach half into even slices and place in cream-lined tart shells, retaining rounded shape of each peach half as much as possible.

Pass remaining whipped cream mixture separately.

WHEAT NUT MEAT CUPS

- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 branch celery, chopped (include leaves)
- 2 tbs. bacon drippings
- 1 cup tomato juice
- 1/2 cup Kinslow's Wheat Nuts
- 1 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- 1 carrot, grated
- 2 tbs. chopped parsley
- 1/4 tsp. thyme
- 1/2 cup nonfat dry milk powder
- 1 egg

Saute onion and celery in drippings in 2-qt. saucepan. Add tomato juice, Wheat Nuts, salt and pepper and



COCONUT DROPS

- 1 1/4 cups sifted flour
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 cup soft butter
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
- 1 egg
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1 tsp. coconut flavoring
- 2 cups Cocoa Krispies


Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Blend butter and sugar. Add egg and flavorings and beat well.

Stir in sifted dry ingredients together with cereal. Drop by spoonfuls onto greased baking sheets.

Bake at 375 degrees about 12 minutes. Makes about 2 1/2 dozen cookies.

Remove from heat and add carrot, parsley, thyme, dry milk, egg and meat. Blend thoroughly with a fork. Spoon into 12 greased muffin tins.

Sprinkle with paprika and bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

Commission Formed To Combat Crime

The formation of a district attorney's commission on crime and delinquency was announced by William B. McKesson, Los Angeles County District Attorney, who said that the purpose of such a body would be to render the experience, energy, and wisdom of the community to the effort of law enforcement in the containment of crime.

McKesson said he was cognizant and appreciative of current crime prevention activity conducted by various public and civic-minded organizations; however, the rising crime ratio

is of such significance as to warrant serious concern and compels new emphasis be placed on communal and individual responsibilities and obligations to the maintenance of law and order.

McKesson contended that current research indicated there is no better place to implement this new emphasis than at the county level. He said, "Since August of 1961, I have had under advisement the creation of a district attorney's commission on crime and delinquency. I am pro-

foundly aware and appreciative of the spirit and value of such a commission." McKesson pointed out that a countywide program to combat crime and delinquency is a relatively new concept.

McKesson said he would appoint both men and women with first-rate minds, of distinguished community stature, and excellent administrative and technical abilities to this commission. "It will reflect an adequate representation of the population as a whole, and specifically, of those areas with active interests, concern

and capabilities which can contribute to the success of achieving the desired goals," he declared.

"WE RECOGNIZE," McKesson said, "the need for people with firmness of mind and ability—people who are neither easily persuaded nor dissuaded, and people who will put the public interest above special interest. We have taken every effort to insure the selection of this caliber of individual for membership on this commission. There will be an associate membership section,"

McKesson added, "that will include representatives of law enforcement, education, the church, and other areas concerned with this problem, who will act in an advisory capacity to the commission."

Ronald C. Hibbard, prominent Southern California civic leader and executive vice president of Whitcomb Schools was named secretary of the district attorney's commission on crime and delinquency by McKesson.

McKesson said that names of additional members of the district attorney's commission on crime and delinquency will be made public on their appointment. "Reports concern-

ing the activities of the crime commission will be issued periodically to all news media," he said.

ACCORDING TO McKesson, the inaugural organization meeting of the crime commission will take place shortly after his return from Europe in mid-July.

The District Attorney launched his new concept for the suppression and containment of crime and delinquency at a testimonial dinner in his honor on Aug. 30, 1961. His premise was there must be regeneration of respect by both the adults and youth of our community for constituted authority.
