Church Leaders to Attend Conference

Torrance's three Methodist churches will send six laymen and ministers to the Southern California - Arizona Conference June 18 through 24 at the University of Redlands in Redlands.

Plans will be presented to embark on a year-long program in the Conference's 420 churches to fill the ranks where leader shortages exist, and overcome widespread and tragic ignorance of Biblical materials and basic knowledge of the Christian faith.

Presided over by Bishop Gerald Kennedy, of Los Angeles, the Conference will open with an evening communion service, June 18.

THE ANNUAL conference is the basic administrative body of The Methodist Church, and is composed of ordained ministers and lay members elected from each local church.

Its chief business will be to review completed and projected programs of 50 boards, commissions, committees and institutions, and the budgets to sustain them, as well as vote the Southern California - Arizona Conference's share of Methodism's national and worldwide enterprises.

Bishop Kennedy will ordain new ministers, June 23, and read the appointment of ministers to churches for the traditional Conference closing on Sunday, June 24.

THE SPEAKER at the evening programs will be Dr. Joseph Sittler, a Lutheran theologian who believes that the people of God have no right to cease from the quest of unity. "If there were not already given to us a real unity in Christ we should not even be seeking the unity of the church," he said in a recent statement.

From 1943-57, he served as professor of systematic theology at Chicago Lutheran Theological Seminary. Since then he has taught in a similar capacity at the University of Chicago Divinity School.

DR. GEORGE A. WARNER, Jr., director of university relations at Boston University, will address a Press Dinner, June 19, at First Methodist Church, Redlands.

Speaker for Laymen's Day, June 23, will be Dr. Daniel Walker, pastor of First Methodist Church, Santa Monica.

Budgets totaling nearly \$3 million are up for approval, and during the week the Board of Christian Social Concerns will present 15 resolutions on subjects from extremist groups to tariffs.

Leader Training Sessions Planned for Great Books

James Pierson, president of the Great Books South Bay District, announced that registration is now open for a leader training institute on the Santa Barbara campus of the University of California the week of July 22.

The Institute is sponsored by the Southwestern Area of the Great Books Foundation and will be conducted by Mrs. Susan Smith, area director. It is open to anyone in Southern California, Arizona, or Utah who is interested in starting discussion groups. Both basic and advanced leader training will be offered.

PIERSON noted that this is a unique opportunity to learn the techniques of communication in a vacation setting at a nominal cost. Participants will live on the campus and have the use of the college library and beach. The schedule of meetings provides time for enjoyment of the recreational facilities and scenic attractions of the Santa Barbara area.

The central theme of the Institute is freedom — personal, artistic and political. Readings will include works by Epicurus, John Stuart Mill, Edmund Burke, Kierkegaard, and Thomas Mann.
