Employment Office Asks Jobs For Torrance Area Students

With the end of the school year, thousands of local high school and college students are seeking jobs, according to Murray W. Love, manager, California Department of Employment, Torrance office.

The State Employment Service is making an all-out effort to find jobs for as many students and graduates as possible, he said. Both employers and job seekers may register with any office of the State Employment Service. Aptitude and proficiency tests and vocational counseling sessions are scheduled daily.

"The community will benefit in many ways if employers will use the student labor pool created by summer vacations and graduation from high school and college for over 360,000 students in Los Angeles County alone," Love stated.

Some of the benefits, according to Love are:

"Business and industry gain by tapping the resources of an above-average group with at least partial training in many occupations.

"In the economic race with totalitarian countries, the nation as a whole gains by adding new skills and on-the-job experience to the future work

force that may be asked to make a maximum contribution to America's struggle. In addition, youth on payrolls add to the general buying power.

"The students themselves will benefit by being productively occupied. The non-graduate will be able to get funds to continue his education," Love pointed out.

AGES OF THE STUDENTS run from the early teens to the graduate college students who hold an advanced degree. Their skills range from lawn mowing and baby sitting to cost accounting and laboratory research, Love said. In between are skilled typists, shop trainees, sales personnel, deliverymen, and about any other occupation an employer could name.

The duration of the jobs can be from one hour to permanent, Love said, adding that all resources of the State Employment Service are available to applicants and employers without charge. In many occupational classifications, test-selected applicants can be referred to employers, and these workers will have a high probability of success on the job, according to Love.

Miss Kabe will portray "Laura Partridge," the part Judy Holliday made famous in the movie version.


