Adventists Move Services To Annual Camp Meeting

Services of Torrance Seventh-day Adventist Church, 1610 Acacia Ave., will be transferred for the second week to the giant 59th Annual Camp Meeting of Southland Seventh-day Adventists, 4100 Imperial Hwy, Lynwood, Saturday morning.

The 260-member local congregation is meeting with members from 83 other Southland Adventist churches at the giant convocation which began on June 22 and continues through Saturday.

"Our members are enjoying the spiritually elevating presentations of this great religious session," said Pastor Glenn L. Goffar in commenting on the local church's participation in the giant meet.

PASTOR GOFFAR said between 15,000 and 20,000 worshippers are expected at the 40-acre convocation site in Lynwood this Saturday. Attendance at meetings throughout this week ranged between 5,000 and 12,000, Pastor Goffar said.

Last night many Adventists from Torrance heard minister Don G. Reynolds of Lynwood speak on "Time's Crowning Moment" in the convocation's main 7,000-seat auditorium.

"TIME'S CROWNING moment will be when Jesus Christ comes down from the skies to this earth a second time," the

speaker told local attendees to the convocation.

"Although many people believe the second coming of Christ is found in better social life, or in better government or in better politics, the Bible clearly states that His coming is literal and that every eye shall see Him," said Mr. Reynolds.

"CHRIST'S COMING," said the clergyman, "will do what our science cannot do, what our parliaments and senates struggle with but can never accomplish, what our armies and navies fight for but never achieve. His coming brings an eternal and completely peaceful mode of life to those who choose to follow Him in today's everyday life."

This evening at 8 o'clock Adventists from Torrance will hear Dr. A. Graham Maxwell, director of the school of religion, Loma Linda University, Loma Linda, Calif., speak on "Faith and the Seventh-day Adventist."

AT 7:30 tonight local persons attending the convocation will hear Adventist West Coast leader W. S. Lee bring a message entitled, "The Joy of Obedience," in the main convocation auditorium.
