Harbor to Open New Building

Opening of the new Harbor Savings and Loan Assn., \$150,000 South Shores branch office building was announced by Joe Wall, president of the Redondo Beach based association.

Located in the \$550,000 Harbor Village development at 2470 Western Ave., San Pedro, the office is headed by manager Dick Hagler, assistant vice president, who grew up in San Pedro and has been in charge of the temporary South Shores office since last December.

The success of the South Shores office for the short time it has been in operation is little short of phenomenal, Hagler declared. The number of savers, he said, already is approaching 1,000 individual accounts.

Hagler also said, the directors of Harbor Savings had voted to continue the 4 3/4 percent rate on earnings for the third quarter of this year. Association total resources now are \$17 million, with reserves the highest in history.
