### Chapel Explains Three Categories Of Resolutions

There are three types of resolutions passed by the California State Legislature without reference to the other house, but the phrase "House Resolution" is not used in releasing information to the public.

Instead, a resolution introduced in the assembly is referred to as an Assembly Resolution and one in the state senate is called a Senate Resolution, and in either case the resolution has a number, such as Assembly Resolution 1, or Senate Resolution 1.

If you read in the newspaper a reference to "H.R. 1234," that indicates that it is a bill introduced in the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States.

These facts are important for the public to understand because members of the California Legislature constantly get mail telling them how to vote on "H.R. 2345," or requesting copies of "H.R. 4567." We then must write to our constituents and tell them that this is a bill introduced by a congressman in Washington, D.C., and all correspondence should be sent to a constituent's own congressman and not to state legislators.

**CONCURRENT** Resolutions relate to matters to be voted on by both houses of the California State Legislature. A Concurrent Resolution can be introduced in either house. When introduced in the assembly, it is known as an Assembly Concurrent Resolution and is designated "A.C.R.," followed by a number, thus: A.C.R. 321. When introduced in the state senate, it is designated as "S.C.R.," followed by a number, thus: S.C.R. 789.

**Joint Resolutions** are those which relate to matters connected with the federal government. A Joint Resolution introduced in the assembly is designated as "A.J.R.," followed by a number, thus: A.J.R. 5. A Joint Resolution introduced in the state senate is designated as "S.J.R.," followed by a number, thus: S.J.R. 7.

**THE DISTRIBUTION** of a Joint Resolution varies according to the wording. For example, a concluding paragraph may direct that inscribed copies be mailed to both U.S. senators from California and to all members of the House of Representatives from California. Sometimes it is worded so that the President of the United States gets a copy. A Joint Resolution frequently

provokes a long debate, usually along partisan lines, although the opposing factions may be regional and not partisan. For example, a Joint Resolution telling congress and the President that the legislature wants a change in appropriations for foreign aid may stir up a debate which is entirely partisan, or there may be both Republicans and Democrats on each side of the question.

A **JOINT** Resolution on foreign aid by the U. S. Government, however, is not a good example of a resolution which causes debate based on regional interest unless it relates to sending surplus agricultural products to foreign countries. In that case, the California legislators from predominantly agricultural districts would tend to vote according to the interests of their constituents and not along political party lines. However, this is an oversimplification. Often, it is difficult to determine whether a legislator is voting along party lines or for the majority of his constituents.

Since Joint Resolutions by definition are those which relate to matters connected with the federal government, it's interesting to know that U. S. senators and members of the House of Representatives usually pay absolutely no attention to the Joint Resolutions which they receive from the California State Legislature.

**THEY SELDOM** admit this publicly or in letters to constituents but most California legislators have been told privately by U.S. senators and members of the U.S. House of Representatives so often that most of us are convinced that passing Joint Resolutions and sending them to Washington, D.C., is a waste of time and money.

The question then arises: "Why does the California Legislature continue to pass Joint Resolutions and send them to Washington if such resolutions are ignored?"

The obvious answer is that it is done at the request of constituents who want us to "put pressure on Congress." Members of the legislatures of several other states have told me that their experience with the U.S. Congress is the same as that of the California Legislature. Personally I believe that if individuals write direct to their own congressmen and their own U. S. senators, they get better results than they do when they ask us to pass Joint Resolutions.


