



The exercise was commanded by Vice Adm. R.T.S. Keith, commander, 1st Fleet.

USS WEST VIRGINIA

THE CARNAGE OF DECEMBER 7, 1941 AT PEARL HARBOR IS PART HISTORY—THE U.S. NAVY SUFFERED THE GREATEST DEFEAT IN ITS HISTORY. BUT THAT IT LUCKED ITS WOUNDS AND FOUGHT ON TO VICTORY IS BEST EXEMPLIFIED IN THE STORY OF THE WEST VIRGINIA.

SUNK AT HER BERTH THE WEST VIRGINIA WAS RAISED, COMPLETELY MODERNIZED AND BACK IN ACTION IN 1944. HER REVENGE WAS COMPLETE WHEN SHE ENTERED SAGAMI BAY, JAPAN, WITH THE OCCUPATION FORCES IN AUGUST 1954.
