BRISKET OF BEEF WITH LIMA BEANS

3 Lbs. Boneless Beef Brisket
4 Cups Boiling Water
2 Teaspoons Salt

1 1/2 Cups Large Dried Lima Beans
1 Stalk Celery — Diced
1 Teaspoon Prepared Horseradish
1 Carrot — Diced

Place meat and water in large, heavy pot. Add salt and lima beans. Bring to boil; cover, reduce heat and simmer for three hours. Add remaining ingredients and cook one hour longer, or until meat and beans are very tender. Serve hot with horseradish sauce.
