Garden Checklist

1. Deep watering is essential in August to keep lawns and shrubs happy. Hand held sprinklers are seldom held long enough to do the most good.
2. Lawns should be checked for water penetration. Poke a stick in to a depth of several inches and see how much of it comes up dry. You might be surprised at how little moisture is getting down into the soil.
3. Renew overgrown and rangy hedges by cutting them back drastically. They won't look their best for a few weeks, but in the long run such treatment benefits them.
4. Set out annuals for late summer and fall bloom. Nurseries have a good supply in August.
5. Many Indica Azaleas are getting set for a fall bloom. Be sure to water them frequently and feed them this month with an acid fertilizer.
