A new discount department store and associated super market developed to meet the burgeoning population shopping needs near Torrance Del

The new White Front Store is located on Hawthorne Avenue and Torrance Boulevard on land owned by Del Amo Estates Corp., and will provide 130,000 square feet of space and parking for 1,500 cars. Associated with the department store is the market and a service station and tire shop

Architects and engineers for the project are Daniel, Mann, Johnson & Mendenhall with Oltmanns Construction Co. as general contractors. TV CANDIDS by Terrence O'Flaherty

The arm-chair Tarzan of the television adventure jungles came swinging through town this week.

He is Jack Douglas, the man who brought home movies to TV in "I Search for Adventure," "Kingdom of the Sea," "Bold Journey" and "Seven League" Boots—all enormously popular television programs that are still running wild all over the dial.

Douglas is as bad an actor as Ed Sullivan, but he is unquestionably the czar of the travel-adventure empire and the television heir to the cloak of M-G-M's James Fitzpatrick whose travelogues introduced a whole generation of Americans to foreign lands in the Thirties.

Douglas's idea was so simple that it's astonishing it wasn't tried long ago. In 1954 on "I Search for Adventure" he gave real people (as opposed to "actor" people) the chance to come on television, describe their travels, and show their home movies made abroad. The fact that the people were amateurs and the films were silent did not discourage anyone. Matter of fact, in a medium that had become increasingly phony, the Real People seemed refreshingly real indeed.

I'm one of those people who dislike home movies more than anything I can think of with the possible exception of income taxes. I do not like to take them, be in them, or watch them. When I see someone bring out the little white screen and the reels they took last year at Crater Lake, I'm out the door and in the car.

But somehow I find the Douglas shows fascinating because they are so admirably honest—whether they are showing views of the Amazons at sunset or fertility rites of natives in New Guinea—and you can't get much more honest than that!

Douglas bounded into the office like a great big teddy bear handsomely dressed by a Beverly Hills tailor. I got the impression that he is a good guy, though slightly square. And he is full of so much overgrown innocence that I almost thought I was talking to Carol Channing.

I liked him even better when I discovered he never takes home movies. But then, who would want to when you're surrounded by 'em?

Douglas was born in Persia in 1921, and came to America with his parents when he was seven.

"I'm an Assyrian," he explained. This is easy to believe. He's a big man with a big face and features. If you'd put him in a pointed hat and a long curly beard he'd look exactly like one of those Assyrian warriors riding a chariot in a bas relief.

The King of the Travel-Adventure world hasn't been outside of California for 12 years—and then only as far away as Seattle.

"If I were to take a trip I'd go to Australia first because they like Americans there and then I'd go to Ceylon because there's everything there—scenery, mountains, aborigine tribes..."

"Aborigine tribes!" I echoed.

"Well, when you get tired of the scenery in a place it's nice to be able to look at the natives," he said earnestly. And, of course, he had me there.

Street Work Slated Soon
