

## CDC Gains Power Through Threats, Says Assemblyman

The California Democratic Council, usually abbreviated "C.D.C.", was founded at Asilmar in January, 1953, and Alan Cranston, now state controller, was the first president at the founding convention on Nov. 29, 1953. In 1962, it claims 60,000 members in California, which is about 1.5 percent of the number of registered Democrats in California, but through propaganda, noise and threats to Democratic Party candidates, it has achieved power and prominence all out of proportion to its size.

Any Democratic Party candidate in a contested primary election usually tries to get the C.D.C. endorsement. I say "usually" because it is a matter of record that some Democrats have publicly repudiated the C.D.C. activities, although they continue to accept the support of the C.D.C. members.

The very obvious reason that these prominent candidates have repudiated portions of the C.D.C. platform and policies is that if the majority of the voters, both Republican and Democratic, become educated in the goals of the C.D.C. they will not vote for candidates who march under the C.D.C. banner.

THE C.D.C. at their state-wide meeting in Fresno, in February, 1960, said, under the heading of "Civil Liberties":

"The House Un-American Activities Committee should be abolished. Investigation of treason and sedition should be handled by governmental bodies other than legislative committees. Secret committees should be eliminated. Publication of names of subpoenaed witnesses should be prohibited. No committees should investigate in areas infringing freedom of thought, speech, or association.

"All state and federal non-disloyalty oaths should be abolished. All legislation inhibiting powers of the Supreme Court in the field of civil liberties should be defeated."

THE C.D.C. at their state-wide meetings in Santa Monica, in March, 1961, under the heading of "Civil Liberties," said:

"... we hereby reaffirm our continued support and endorsement of the policy positions which we have previously taken on such fundamental issues as non-disloyalty oaths, capital punishment, the practices of legislative investigating committees . . .," etc, etc.

The C.D.C. at their state-wide meeting in Fresno, January, 1962, omitted all of the above material from their discussions but they made no effort to repudiate their previous resolutions.

THE PLAIN conclusion to be drawn from the above excerpts from the resolutions of the C.D.C. in 1960 and 1961, and the failure of the C.D.C. in 1962 to repudiate their past positions, is that the C.D.C. advocates that loyalty to the United States is not a qualification for holding state or federal office; that no U. S. Congressional committee should have the right to investigate Communist infiltration and subversion; and that top-secret, classified military and naval information should be made public.

Furthermore, it is obvious that the C.D.C. does not want any future reversals of the U. S. Supreme Court decisions which have greatly restricted anti-subversive legislation in California and in the U. S. Congress.

THE ABOVE quotations from official C.D.C. meetings cover only one small area of the C.D.C. activities, but they make it clear that all candidates for public office should answer the following questions:

1. Do you favor the continued activities of the U. S. House Un-American Activities Committee or do you want it abolished?
2. Are you in favor or opposed to the publication of the names of witnesses subpoenaed by the U. S. House Un-American Activities Committee?
3. Do you favor the retention of federal and state loyalty oaths or do you want them abolished?
4. Are you in favor of capital punishment or do you want it abolished?
5. Referring again to loyalty oaths, do you believe that a person should be permitted to teach in the public schools of California who has been a member of the Communist Party, or a member of one of the organizations identified by the U. S. Attorney General as "Communist front" organizations?

### One-Parent Families In Survey

Dr. A. D. Krems, first vice president of National Parents Without Partners, will be the guest speaker tomorrow at 8 p.m. for the group's meeting in the Empire Room of the Breakers International Hotel, 210 E. Ocean Blvd., Long Beach.

The Beverly Hills-West Los Angeles Chapter of PWP, where Dr. Krems is a member, has been conducting a survey of single parents and children in a one-parent family.

The survey is a several page questionnaire to be answered by single parents and the children in each home. From the findings of this research, the group hopes to find a better understanding of the problems particular to such families.

It is the first time such a survey has been attempted.

Single parents are invited to the meeting. Custody of the children is not necessary.

Several small discussion groups will be set up and signed up at the meeting.
