## Ner Tamid Readies High Holiday Rites

Congregation Ner Tamid of South Bay is preparing for its second High Holiday Services since the synagogue's conception one-and-one-half years ago. Services will be held at the Mormon Chapel, 2000 W. 174th St., on Rosh Hashonah, Friday, Sept. 28 through Sunday, Sept. 30. Sept. 30 services will be held at Temple Beth El, 1435 W. 7th, San Pedro, and on Yom Kippur, Sunday, Oct. 7 and Monday, Oct. 8.

Rabbi Bernard Wechsberg, Ner Tamid's full-time spiritual leader, came to this city on April 1 from Chicago's Congregation Habonim and will conduct his first High Holiday Services with Ner Tamid. Rabbi Wechsberg, who was

born in Germany, received his education and rabbinical training at the Jewish Theological Seminary of Breslau and at the University of Breslau, and upon graduation was elected spiritual leader by the Jewish Community of Liegnitz, Germany, where he ministered until his immigration to the United States.

Rabbi Wechsberg's rabbinical career in this country began in Los Angeles with the then Highland Park Temple. In 1940, he went to Denver where he was associated with Denver's Beth Hamedrosh Hagodol Synagogue. During this time, he acted as chaplain in Army Camps throughout the State of Colorado.

In 1946, Rabbi Wechsberg was elected by Chicago's Congregation Habonim and served his congregation with distinction for 15 years. He is a past-president of his area's Council of Churches and Synagogues, served as an officer of the Chicago Board of Rabbis, and was most active in the Broadcasting Commission of the Chicago Board of Rabbis in furthering the development of television as a medium for religious inspiration and understandings.

## Subject Matter Courses Called for by Rafferty

An emphasis on subject matter teaching which he referred to as "education in depth," was called for by Dr. Max Rafferty, candidate for California State Superintendent of Public Education, when he spoke to a Torrance audience this week.

The educator, veteran of 22 years as a teacher and administrator, lashed out at what he called the "life adjustment philosophy of education," and called for education which would emphasize the subject being studied whether it be English, history, geography, woodshop, or physical education.

"Only by stressing subject matter is the teacher able to excite the students' interest and challenge them to do their best," he said.

He added that his "education in depth" program is interesting to the teacher as it is a challenge to the student, and it challenges the teacher to bring his full ability and guidance to play.

DR. RAFFERTY called for greater selection of textbooks on the local level, and said elementary districts should have the same right of selection that high school districts now enjoy.

Dr. Rafferty, now superintendent of the La Canada schools, began teaching in 1940 and has been an educator since that time. He is the author of several college and high school textbooks.
