Topic Is Learning To Suffer

Robert A. Wells, pastor of the Narbonne Avenue Baptist Church of Lomita, will speak at both the 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. services on the subject, "A Job for Job."

In the Old Testament, the book is no doubt Job. So almost as long as man has been keeping records, God has been seeking to teach man the art of suffering gracefully. A lesson from Job is in order today, for man has not yet learned to suffer without blaming God. What question is heard more often than "Why did God do this to me?" Here is another job for Job," Mr. Wells will state.

The evening message will be another in the series on the theme, "Lord Teach Us." This week's message will be "Lord Teach Us Thy Word."

"Man has available in the Bible the way to God and the way to live. Yet man must avail himself of that privilege by a study of this source if it is to be of value to him. Failure or refusal to learn from God's word is like a man who has legs refusing to walk," the pastor will state.

Assets on Sept. 10 amounted to \$509,800,383, an increase of \$95,027,426 or 22.9 per cent over the total of \$414,772,957 reported on the same date a year ago, Seliga said.
