

White Front Opening First Unite in City

Grand opening for a new White Front Tire and Automotive Center at 21210 Hawthorne Ave., will be observed this morning.

The center features 18 acres of free parking and air conditioned waiting rooms which include coffee and soft drink vending machines.

WHITE FRONT discount savings stamps are given with purchases of tires, mufflers, brakes, shock absorbers, batteries, seat covers and radios. Stamps worth two cents each are issued for each gallon of gasoline purchased.

Included in opening activities will be Bobbet King, Miss Torrance, who will be there Saturday and Sunday, and television personality Skipper Frank who will be there from 2 to 3 p.m. on the same days.

THE AUTOMOTIVE center is the sixth in the White Front chain. The service department of the new Torrance establishment has 5,000 square feet with an additional 3,000 square feet under canopy.

Installation is available on tires, brakes, mufflers, batteries, radios, safety belts, wheel alignment, shock absorbers and seat covers.

Hours will be 10 a.m. to 9 p.m., Mondays through Fridays; 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. Saturdays and Sundays.

REACTION of Mayor Albert Isen was immediate.

"I'm sure the city can not make a gift of city funds to another district," Isen told the HERALD.

Lynn had told his colleagues on the Board of Education that Torrance would receive an estimated \$1,750,000 in sales tax this year, and that the figure would be doubled if the college were to be located in the city.

"If the city is going to be so pushy in sales tax funds, we could reduce property taxes and the people would benefit just the same," Isen said.

LYNN SAID he had investigated the revenue of the property under consideration for a college site and that it was estimated that the school district would lose between \$100,000 and \$200,000 if the college is placed there.

"It's ironic that people want the college in town and yet they will not vote for bonds so children can reach a college level," Board Member Kurt Shery said.

Consideration of a new election date for the \$8 million bond issue was delayed because of the absence of Board President Albert Charles. The members present were divided on whether to hold the election in February or put it off until the school board election in April.

The trustees meet again Monday evening for their regular meeting, and discussion of the election is certain to be on the agenda.

Citizen of the Year To Be Named Tonight

Torrance's Citizen of the Year will be named tonight at the annual chamber of commerce banquet in Manhattan Beach.

Principal speaker will be James P. Bradley, president of the Dominguez Water Corp., who will narrate "The Torrance Story," a history of the

city from the time its ownership was provisionally granted to Juan Jose Dominguez in March of 1784 as part of the Rancho San Pedro, until the purchase by Jared Sidney Torrance and associates in 1911.

boulevard and Rosecrans Avenue will start at 7 p.m. with a reception in the Mark Twain Room followed by a dinner at 8 p.m. in the Manhattan Room.

New officers and the board of directors will also be installed. Recognition of such firms will mark the beginning of a new annual program.


