Utility Rates in California Among Lowest in the Nation

Rates charged Californians for gas, electric and telephone service are among the lowest anywhere in the nation, it is indicated by the annual study by the California Public Utilities Commission, of the monthly charges in the 25 largest cities of the nation.

George G. Grover, commis-

sion president, said that San Francisco ranks second lowest, Los Angeles third and San Diego 14th among the 25 cities. Only San Antonio, Texas, has a lower combined monthly charge for the three services of \$13.04 than San Francisco, where the total is \$14.11. In Los Angeles the total basic

monthly bill is \$14.37 while San Diegans pay \$16.68 for the same specified amounts and types of service. Charges in other states range upward as high as \$24.73 in one eastern seaboard city for the same service.

THE SURVEY eliminates

climatic conditions by comparing the charge for usage of the same amounts of service in cities throughout the United States; 50 therms of gas, 150 kilowatt hours of electric energy, and individual residential telephone service. The survey is based on rates

in effect on June 30.

Because of the increased usage per customer the computations are based this year on use of 150 kilowatt hours of energy instead of the 100 kwhr previously used. Telephone charges are based in individual service instead of two-

party line service as in the past.

LOS ANGELES and San Diego are the only ones of the 25 cities where residence one-party flat rate telephone service is less than \$5 per month. San Francisco, where the charge is \$5.05 per month, is

third low. The Los Angeles basic monthly charge is \$4.55 and San Diego \$4.90. The next lowest charge for individual line service is \$5.50 per month and the highest \$7.70, or 52 per cent above the rate in San Francisco. These figures do not include the 10 per cent federal excise tax.

Basic telephone rates in the three California cities have been unchanged for the past three years.

CLARA E. WEST


