This offer was extended by the newly-named steering committee for South Bay College at its first meeting. The group is composed of members of the Torrance City Council, educators, and interested citizens appointed by the council.

Also at this initial meeting, the committee urged all residents favoring the location of the four-year state college in Torrance to write their sentiments in a letter and mail it to "College Committee, Torrance City Hall, Torrance."

To do this, we are going to make speakers available to service clubs, PTA groups, and other organizations so that every Torrance citizen can hear for himself, in detail, the benefits this college offers our community," the Rev. David Beadles, newly elected chairman of the group, reported.

He said the group plans to make use of all possible channels to let every interested citizen have an effective part in boosting the city as the college site. For example, the appeal for letters expressing their enthusiasm for a local college offers every citizen the opportunity to be of immediate aid.
