 pressed by many organizations, the Rev. Mr. Beadles said. He pointed out that the Torrance Board of Education, the Hollywood Riviera Homeowners Assn. and a number of PTA groups have either recently adopted resolutions or expressed their hope that the college will be built in Torrance.

It is expected that the State's Site Selection Committee will make their decision following a meeting in Long Beach in early November. Spokesmen for both Torrance and the Peninsula proponents are to be heard at these sessions, it is reported.

"IT IS extremely important that the organizations and citizens in this area make it known that they will welcome the college in Torrance. The Advisory Committee is working to arm this city's representatives when they appear with resolutions from organizations and letters from residents," the Rev. Mr. Beadles said.

He noted that copies of a sample resolution are available by writing "College Committee, Torrance City Hall, Torrance." Residents also were asked to write their letters to the State Committee and mail them to that address.

The Advisory Committee chairman also reported that speakers are available to relate the facts about the college and its location. These speakers can be scheduled by calling Mrs. Don Marousek at FR 5-6886.

**King Defends Programs Of 20 Years in House**

Awards of military and other federal contracts to the area of the 17th Congressional District for 1962 are nearly 20 per cent higher than they were in 1960, and "this is the kind of progress for the district that can be expected to continue for the next two years," Congressman Cecil R. King said as he opened his re-election campaign Sunday in San Pedro.

King, addressing a meeting of the Filipino-American Voters League at the Hacienda Hotel, said that "his close coordination with the Kennedy Administration insures that

this area will not be passed over in the allocation of future federal contracts."

"THE VETERAN legislator who has served the 17th District in Washington for 20 years, covered a wide range of topics pertaining to the area, and blasted "unsupported allegations of my bi-annual gloom and doom opponents."

Highlights of Congressman King's remarks were: "All major contractors in the area will testify to 20 years of helpful cooperation by my office, resulting in billions of dollars of new busi-

ness for the area and a high rate of employment for the district.

"The management of Todd Shipyards Corp. credits my efforts in Congress for the revival of West Coast shipbuilding.

"NEW FEDERAL legislation was passed last week to replace the 6 per cent bid advantage to West Coast shipbuilders which provides that the Maritime Commission can allocate federal ship-construction contracts to Western yards to insure their ability in

case of national defense emergencies.

"The recent \$12-a-ton reduction in West Coast steel prices will also aid the shipbuilding industry here to be more competitive with Eastern shipyards.

"Passage of the Trade Expansion Bill, endorsed by both parties, will not result in injury to the Southern California fishing industry."

"THE MATTER of a location for the new Custom House is still unsettled and certainly is not lost to our district.

"No consolidation of post offices facilities in the 17th Congressional District are planned."
