

Camino Celebrates Homecoming

Once ranked first among the nation's junior college football eleven, twice humbled El Camino will attempt to halt a two-game win drought against Valley College on Saturday at 2 p.m.

Even a win would provide the Warriors with little to celebrate although the game will

climax homecoming festivities at the college.

Successive defeats by Bakersfield and Long Beach have hurled the once-proud Warriors to fifth place in the rugged Metropolitan Conference. Valley will be a decided underdog against the still dangerous Tribe since the Monarchs only

last week broke a 17-game losing skin.

SAN DIEGO absorbed a 14-7 licking from the Monarchs and Valley will be searching for its second upset win in a row against the disappointed Redskin.

Jim Dunn paced for 171 yards and fullback Homer "The Horse" Williams plowed for 115 yards in 23 carries in leading the Long Beach Vikings to its sixth straight win. The Warriors now stand 4-2 for the season, 2-2 in Metro play.

LONG BEACH jumped to an early 16-0 lead with Duane Nixon scoring on a 3-yard run and Williams scooting in from four yards out.

El Camino closed the gap to 16-8 when John Torok fired to end Pat Liningier for the score. Torok then pitched to end Mitch Malpee for the conversion.

WILLIAMS' 25-yard run around right tackle propelled the Vikings into a 24-8 lead late in the second quarter, with Dunn adding the conversion on a quarterback keeper.

Jim Strangeland's potent powerhouse extended LB's advantage to 30-8 when Dunn tossed to Tim Russell in the flank, and the 9.5 sprinter out-faked two helpless Warrior defenders and scooted in from 32 yards out. Williams then rambled across for the conversion.

CAMINO'S swift backfield started penetrating the Viking defense and their speed eventually paid off when Jim Allison culminated a 73-yard march with a 13-yard dash for the score.

Joe Pearson scored LB's last tally on a 7-yard run in the final stanza.

Torrance Devils Upset Inglewood

Led by Bob Kimpel's three touchdowns, the Torrance Blue Devils stunned the Pop Warner football world with a 27-7 victory over the Inglewood Rustlers in a Junior Bantam Division contest on Sunday.

Kimpel scampered 47 yards for one TD and added two more tallies on plunges of four and three yards. The other Devil score came on a five-yard gallop by Bernard Tucker.

Larry Downing, Vince Burchfere, Dan Antonaros, Larry Steuckrath, and Dusty Johnson were credited with fine defensive games.

SHOVING ACROSS three opening period scores, the Torrance Chargers posted a 31-7 win over the Rolling Hills Falcons in a Midget Division encounter.

Greg Jasper was selected as the outstanding Charger lineman and Ron Stone was named the top Torrance back.

STONE HAD one 15-yard TD run called back because of an offside penalty, but on the next play, he slipped 20 yards into the end zone. Stone also tacked on six more points with a 21-yard run.

Steve Jasper matched Stone's scoring by also pushing across two TDs. The other Charger touchdown came on a Bill Perez to Dick Perez aerial. The two boys are brothers.

RETURNING to the win column, the Torrance Vikings posted the Torrance Mustangs, 45-0, in a Peeewe Division contest.

Jack Hase, John Cook, Randy Carter, Chuck Farrar, Greg Boy, Terry Smith, and John Espinoza all figured in the scoring for the Vikings.

Topping the Vikings in line play were Steve Patton, Steve Cole and Pat Froom.

Parnelli Top Pilot At Ascot

Parnelli Jones, 29-year-old Torrance leadfoot, will be shooting for his second straight national championship when he competes before the home folks in J. C. Agajanian's USAC sprint car program Saturday night at Ascot Park.

Racing starts at 8:30 p.m. with one-lap qualifying at 6:30 p.m.

Agajanian has posted a guaranteed purse of \$5,000 against 40 per cent of the gate to lure the finest field of drivers and machines to compete in a Southland USAC oval track program.

JONES, FIRST driver to crack the Indianapolis 150 miles per hour qualifying barrier, has a commanding point lead for the sprint car crown after 18 national races on tracks from Milwaukee, Wis., to Langhorne, Pa. If he finishes among the first 10 he will be champion again.

No easy path faces Jones Saturday night however, for most of his Indy pals are entered as well as the local gang, headed by Colby Scroggins of Eagle Rock, Billy Cantrell of Anaheim, Allen Heath of Northridge, Dee Jones of Phoenix and Bobby Hogle of Buena Park.
