
Optimist Club Sponsors Youth Appreciation Week

Youth Appreciation Week, which is sponsored by the 2,100 clubs of Optimist International in the United States and Canada, is dedicated to redeem the reputation of the 95 per cent of today's teenagers who practice juvenile delinquency, not delinquency, Petrat told the club.

Cliff Graybehl has been appointed general chairman of Youth Appreciation Week activities. Graybehl, a charter member of the Torrance Club and former Torrance High School coach, is an outstanding youth booster in this area.

The 1962 program activities will include the sponsorship of eight awards to be given to outstanding student citizens

from four Torrance High Schools. The awards will be presented at an awards dinner at the Thunderbird Hotel tonight. Perry O'Brien will be the speaker of the evening.

New Phone Cable Due In Cabrillo

A Pacific Telephone project is under way to replace a small outdated cable unsuited to the changing complexion of a section of Torrance.

A new 2,900-foot cable will provide more than three times the existing facilities and will run in Cabrillo Avenue, between Carson and 222nd Streets, according to manager Dick Pyle.

He said a company crew will feed the cable into an underground conduit system in the parkway along Cabrillo through the use of manholes. Splicing and other associated work is expected to extend the \$18,000 job into the first two months of 1963.

"Several apartment buildings are completed or under construction in that area," Pyle pointed out. "An extension of the Harbor Freeway south of here is expected to result in more homes and businesses, as well as light industry."


