

Rites Set For Early Developer

Bronson C. Buxton, pioneer Torrance real estate developer and prominent civic leader, died in Santa Ana Monday where he had been confined in illness. Funeral services have been scheduled in Torrance Friday afternoon.

Mr. Buxton came to Torrance in 1927 to take over the business of George W. Neill, a pioneer real estate firm in the city. He was a native of Falls Church, Va., where he was born on May 17, 1877, and was graduated with the Class of '99 from George Washington University in Washington, D.C.

Mr. Buxton is survived by two daughters, Virginia Everett of Orange and Margot Buxton Schlick of Arcadia, four grandsons, a granddaughter, and a great-granddaughter.

HE ENTERED the business world in Newton, Mass., with the infant automobile industry, working with the Locomobile manufacturers where he was employed for nearly 25 years.

When he came to California in 1926 he was vice president of the Apperson Co. in Kokomo, Ind. He toured Southern California and chose Torrance as his home, moving here in March, 1927.

Mr. Buxton immediately began building homes and selling real estate in the Torrance area.

MR. BUXTON was a member of the Torrance Rotary Club for many years and served as its president in 1941-42. He was active in the Torrance-Lomita Board of Realtors and also served that group as president at one time.

Hugh Dooley, principal at the Crenshaw School, told the HERALD that the petition the PTA submitted to the school board asking for the pedestrian overpass did not ask that 187th Street be closed.

"With the overpass our problem will essentially be solved," Dooley said.

County Supervisor Kenneth Hahn said approximately 95 per cent of the 800 children attending the school cross the busy thoroughfare to attend classes. Traffic counts show that about 16,000 cars per day pass the school.
