School Playgrounds Plan Holiday Events

The Los Angeles City School System, Youth Services Section, South Elementary District, under the direct supervision of Harry W. Phillips, physical education supervisor, announced this week that seventy-seven elementary school playgrounds will be open during Christmas vacation. There will be extensive programs in

crafts, group games, and marginal games starting tomorrow and continuing through Dec. 21, and again on Dec. 26 through Dec. 28. Hours will be from 12:30 to 4:30 p.m.

Special events throughout the vacation period such as football or basketball, pentathlon programs, a physical fitness program for boys and girls, folk dancing, story telling, roller skating, a Christmas puppet show, talent shows, Christmas and New Years parties will be included.

Supervising these activities on the playgrounds, will be trained recreational specialists, largely certificated teachers who will attend a three hour in-service training class tomorrow in preparation for the Christmas program.

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
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
