The Republican Cat is Out of The Bag, Assemblyman Says

Julia Ward Howe was born in 1819 and was promoted to a better existence when her physical body was burned in 1910. Inspired by the spiritual acts and words of Abraham Lincoln, and other idealists who were trying to implement their ideal through material means during the Civil War, she wrote "The Battle Hymn of the Republic," which was first published in the February, 1862 issue of the Atlantic Monthly. The most important verse of the song, which is seldom sung today, reads as follows, with the words "HIS" and "HE" written with a capital letter "H", for reasons obvious to anyone who understands the Christian religion:

"In the glory of the lilies, Christ was born across the sea,
"With a glory in His bosom

that transfigures you and me;
"As He died to make men holy, let us die to make men free,
"While God is marching on."

UNFORTUNATELY, even today, in the year 1962, all men and women are not free and equal except in the sight of God. This lack of freedom even exists among Republicans, regardless of their race, religion or national origin. The Republicans of California are right now being betrayed by so-called leaders, both great and small. When these self-appointed leaders betray members of their own Republican Party, they do not want us to either live or die to make men free.

For several weeks I received letters and telephone calls from various so-called Republican leaders telling me

that in order to regain power, the Republican Party must present a united front to the people of California; that Republican office-holders can meet secretly, argue with one another, resolve our minor points of dispute; and then all give the same statement to the press and the people of California setting forth the Republican policy from time to time during the next two years so that we can come back into power on both the state and national level in 1964.

On the morning of Saturday, Dec. 8, in Los Angeles County, I attended a meeting where only incumbents and recently elected Republican office-holders were present. The presiding officer, who called the meeting on his own authority, which is slim, did as much talking as the Republican office-holders, although we were

told in advance that the sole purpose was to get acquainted, agree on presenting a united front to the press and public, and thereby attain unity and harmony in order to regain power.

HE ANNOUNCED that everyone would be permitted to speak except that one other Republican Member of the Assembly and I would talk after the luncheon. Naturally, this aroused my curiosity, hence I insisted upon questioning several men, and succeeded in spite of the very obvious intention of the presiding officer to muzzle me. He did not want me to bring out the truth before the newly-elected officials.

(1) The self-appointed leaders, after the defeat of Nixon in November, 1962, contacted Nelson Aldrich Rockefeller, Governor of New York and obtained at least his oral consent to be the Republican candidate for President of the United States, on the Republican ballot in California at the June 1964 election.

(2) THESE MEN also decided that since Rockefeller would be the only Republican candidate for President of the United States on the June 1964 Republican ballot, they could safely slide Republicans to "the middle of the road" gradually, but firmly, in the name of party unity and harmony, and that all Republicans who dared to dissent would be attacked as "trying to split the party," "reactionaries," and "John Birchers." In other words, in order to get Democratic votes in November 1964, Republicans are supposed to forget all our past principles such as individual freedom and home rule. We are supposed to become "liberals" or "moderates," but not true Republicans.

(3) These same men have arranged to hire at a tremendous salary out of Republican funds one of the men who "handled" public relations for Richard M. Nixon. The man they hire is prepared to write the new liberal, moderate, left-wing Republican party "line" as part of the program to elect Rockefeller President of the United States.
