### Red Cross Seeks Aid In Blood Bank Drive,

Red Cross continues to seek more blood donors who will "Save-A-Life-Sunday" by giving blood during the 8 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. collection next Sunday at the Regional Red Cross Blood Center, 1130 S. Vermont, Los Angeles.

Mrs. Robert Orsini, blood chairman for Red Cross in Torrance, is in hopes donors from this community will be among those giving the 1,000 pints Red Cross hopes to collect.

"A few minutes of your time can mean a lifetime to someone sick or injured," Mrs. Orsini says.

APPOINTMENTS for the "Save-A-Life Sunday" blood bank can be made by calling Red Cross, FA 8-1510.

Mrs. Orsini points out that "coming just two days before Christmas, the Sunday blood bank will be a grand opportunity for us all to be a real Santa Claus this year."

She says that giving blood Sunday can be virtually sure that their blood will be flowing in someone else's veins in a matter of a few days, as a pint

of blood is seldom on the shelves of the Red Cross cooler more than three days and at this time of year, even less time.

With Christmas and New Year observances falling on successive Mondays and Tuesdays this year, only six good donor days are left in which to procure the blood that will be needed during the last two weeks of the year.

IN ORDER to prevent a situation which "could become critical," every possible donor is being invited to participate in the "Save-A-Life-Sunday" collection.

Shuttle service to the Blood Center from Southwestern regional Red Cross headquarters, 279 W. Beach, is being provided to donors needing transportation.

Buses, donated by M & M Charter Bus Lines, Harbor City, will leave Inglewood at 10 a.m., noon, 2 and 4 p.m., and return as soon as the donors have made their contributions.
