Garden Checklist

1. May dormant trees—especially fruit trees—should be pruned now. Don't prune spring-flowering shrubs and trees until after their bloom, however.
2. Daphne, heather, azaleas and camellias are all to be found in bloom now and may be planted for quick color.
3. Peach trees should be sprayed to prevent leaf curl later on.
4. Snails and slugs love the cool weather. Scatter snail pellets to keep their populations from building up.
5. Plant roses and all other deciduous trees and shrubs now.



Harbor College to Offer Creative Writing Course

Writers' Round Table, English 27, a college course in creative writing, will be offered in the Evening Division during the spring semester at Harbor College, announced Dwight Garner, chairman of the Humanities Division. The class, which meets on Wednesday evenings from 6:30 to 9:30 starting the week of Feb. 4, carries three units of college credit transferable to Long Beach State College. Deadline to apply for the course is Jan. 25. The course is designed for

those who like to write and who seek professional evaluation of their work. Writing ideas are examined for their publication possibilities. Students read their poems, plays, stories, essays, or articles, for informal discussion or criticism by the class instructor. The class offers opportunities for the development of writing talent as well as practice in basic techniques.

SAMUEL BLUEFARB, the new instructor for the course, received his masters degree from the University of Southern California and is pursuing his doctorate in English at the University of Colorado. He is the author of numerous short stories and articles, and has a novel in progress. Applications for admission to the Evening Division are being accepted now at the admissions office of the college. Early applicants will have the opportunity of priority registration. "Samuel Bluefarb, our new instructor for Writers' Round Table, is exceptionally well-qualified to instruct the course," stated Garner, "and we are fortunate to have him on our day and evening staff for the spring semester."
