Russian Offered By Harbor

A beginning course in Russian will be offered in the spring semester at Los Angeles Harbor College. It was announced by Dwight Garner, chairman of the humanities division.

The class, offered for the first time in the evening division, is designed to include writing the language in Russian script, oral practice and reading of elementary material.

Class hours are 6 to 7 p.m. on Tuesdays and 6:30 to 9:30 on Thursdays.

Instructor of the 4-unit class will be Mrs. Irene R. Rydelek, who taught the initial class of Russian which she helped form at South High School in Torrance.

MRS. RYDELEK has taught classes here and in New York in French, German, and English on the secondary and adult education levels. Her experience includes translating technical reports for a chemical firm in New York state where she was employed early in her career.

Her contacts with Russian began at an early age, when she was taught the language by her grandparents. Currently she is compiling a reader in Russian. She and her husband, Robert, recently toured Western Europe and the Soviet Union.

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
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
