 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING THE ANNEXATION TO THE SAID CITY OF TORRANCE OF CERTAIN UNINHABITED TERRITORY, DESIGNATED AS "LOMITA FLIGHT STRIP" IN CONFORMANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF AN ANNEXATION OF UNINHABITED TERRITORY ACT OF 1959.

Doctors Urge Yearly Health Examinations

Many people believe doctors are not interested in examining the presumably healthy. The reverse is true, according to Dr. Richard J. Lescoe of Torrance, district education chairman of the American Cancer Society's Centinela Valley branch.

The society for years has urged annual health checkups for the well as the best protection against cancer. "This program was initiated by doctors, and doctors give their whole-hearted support," Dr. Lescoe said.

THE REASON health checkups are so important is that the earlier cancer is detected, the easier it can be cured. Doctors are trained to observe dangerous conditions which may not be apparent to patients themselves. Also doctors have at hand modern diagnostic tools which may help detect cancer in its earliest pre-symptomatic stages.

Dr. Lescoe pointed out that very few checkups reveal cancer. "But if its early, curable cancer, this makes the whole process worthwhile for both doctors and their patients. And when patients are given a clean bill of health, as the great majority are, this too is extremely gratifying all the way around."
