

Marymount Offers Varied Program Spring Semester

Registration is now under way for the second semester of the 1962-63 academic season at Marymount College, with an enlarged schedule of day and extension classes awaiting students on the cliffside campus in Palos Verdes Estates.

Also marking a milestone in the campus building program which calls for an eventual 14 major buildings is the opening of the second student residence, St. Gertrude's Hall, constructed at a cost of \$1,191,000.

St. Gertrude's Hall is now the third side of the central quadrangle, which will be enclosed with the erection of the chapel. Next on the building program will be a cultural center and another classroom building.

Necessary for Employers to File Form 599

California employers, now preparing Forms W-2 for the United States Internal Revenue Service, should also prepare Forms 599 for the California Franchise Tax Board, State Controller Alan Cranston said today.

Cranston, chairman of the Franchise Tax Board, reminded employers that they must file information returns with the state for each single employee who was paid \$1,500 or more and each married employee who was paid \$3,000 or more during 1962.

If the employee is a resident of California, a Form 599 must be filed even though the services were performed outside California.

Copies of Federal Form W-2 may be used in place of State Form 599 if it is clearly indicated whether the employee is single or married, and if the copies are accompanied by a summary Form 596.

These must be filed with the Franchise Tax Board on or before Thursday, Feb. 28.

ECC Slates Technical Shorthand

Technical shorthand, a course designed for secretarial workers in specialized fields, will be offered this spring semester at El Camino College.

The class is a part of the evening program and will meet Tuesday and Thursday from 7 to 9:30 p.m.

Purpose of the course will be to build shorthand speed while developing an understanding of technical terminology.

"Our main area of study will be electronics, aircraft and space technology, Miss Maxine Trovethen, course instructor, said.

Students now capable of 80 words per minute or trained in a machine system are eligible for the course.
